
USING HALL KITCHEN TO BAKE FOR COOKIE SALE

St. John Chrysostom's goal for this year is \$9,700

The Stewardship Appeal is used for the:

- **Support of retired priests.** Funds raised through the Stewardship Appeal will provide financial support and gap health insurance coverage for our retired Bishop and the twelve retired priests of our Eparchy. Our retired priests are truly deserving of care and support as they have spent their entire life serving our people.
- **Support of parishes and missions.** For the good of the faithful, we will examine all regions of the Eparchy and determine the way forward. We will provide consultation in financials, capital improvements, and human resources. We will assess the vitality of parishes and determine the establishment of new parishes as we stabilize ourselves as a community first.
- **Support of vocations and seminarian education.** Funds will support the tuition and related costs for men preparing for the priesthood, financial support for the one-year discernment program for men discerning the priesthood, and expenses for priests coming from Europe to serve in our parishes.
