ARE YOU GIVING? Throughout the year we collect goods for W.A.R.M. This is the Westerville Area Resources Ministry. They distribute food and other items for those in need. Since this is the time of year when we think more about giving, you are being asked to make a special effort to donate non-perishable food items, toiletries, diapers, feminine hygiene products and paper goods. Place them around the Christmas tree as you enter our church. The goal is to see this area piled high with donations.

Monetary donations may also be made, make checks out to W.A.R.M. and place in the regular collection baskets by the tetrapod. These donations will be forwarded to W.A.R.M.

PHILIP'S FAST (CHRISTMAS FAST)

- It is a time set aside to spiritually prepare for the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- The emphasis is reflecting on the mystery of the Incarnation of Jesus Christ.
- The Nativity Fast starts earlier than Advent. It begins the day after the feast of St. Philip on the Eastern Catholic liturgical calendar on November 15. This is how the fast became known by another title: Philip's fast. Either title is used.
- The fast period is a full 40 days corresponding to the full 40 days of the Great Lent fast.

REQUIRED ABSTINENCE ON FRIDAYS (NO MEAT), STRONGLY SUGGESTED ABSTINENCE ON MONDAYS AND WEDNESDAYS, THOUGH NOT OBLIGATORY. SATURDAYS AND SUNDAYS NO FASTING. STRONG FASTING FROM DECEMBER 10^{TH} UP TO DECEMBER 24^{TH} , THE VIGIL OF NATIVITY IS STRICT FAST.

CHRISTMAS EVE OBSERVANCE

Since this year Christmas Eve falls on Sunday, there is no fast on this day. In other words, the strict fast is on the previous Friday, 12/22. On 12/24 the Holy Supper can have meat and dairy!

On 12/24 there is the obligation to attend the morning liturgy at 10am which is for the last Sunday before Christmas and the Vigil Liturgy in the evening, which is already part of Christmas!

ECF CHRISTMAS PLAY

Today, there is a Christmas play performed by ECF students in the hall following the Divine Liturgy. Our children would like to offer it as a Christmas gift to our entire community.

COOKIE SALE

Gross income for the cookie sale was \$28,362.00, Expenses were \$6,525.18. 


